



PIPELINE RELINING PROJECT Coming to Your Area

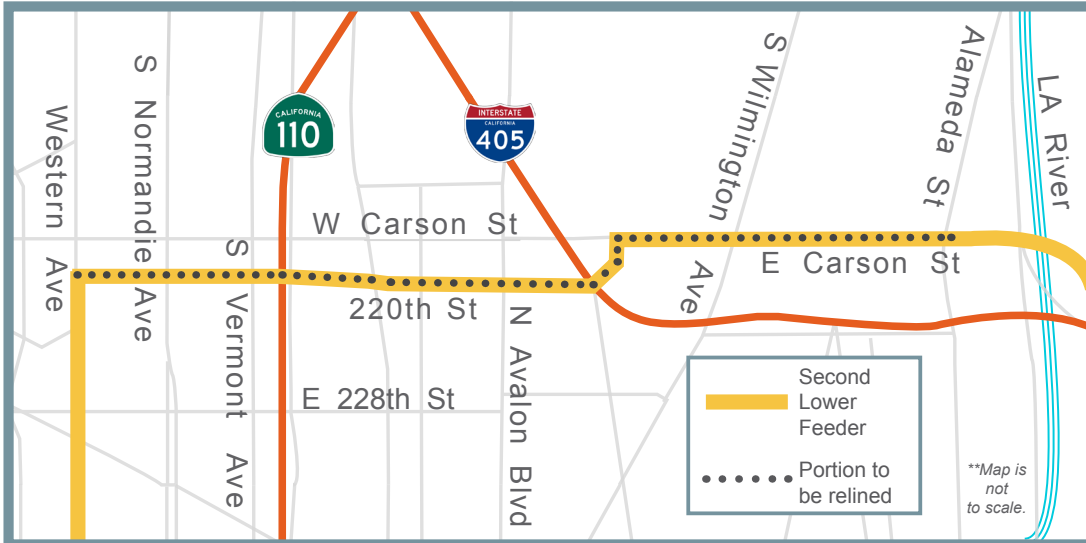

Second Lower Feeder - Reach 2

One of the major pipelines in our regional water system, the Second Lower Feeder, distributes water for 39 miles from the Robert B. Diemer Water Treatment Plant in Yorba Linda to the Palos Verdes Reservoir in Rolling Hills Estates. Built in 1967, the pre-stressed concrete cylinder pipe needs to be relined with steel to ensure future reliability. Pipe relining of the Second Lower Feeder began in October 2017 and is anticipated to take place in phases through the next 8 to 10 years.

The Second Lower Feeder Reach 2 Reline Project will rehabilitate approximately 4.5 miles of this major regional water pipeline within the cities of Carson and Los Angeles, and the County of Los Angeles.

Construction is anticipated to begin in October 2019 and last through June 2020.



Who is Metropolitan?

The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California is a state-established cooperative of 26 member agencies—cities and public water agencies—that serve about 19 million people in six counties. Metropolitan imports water from the Colorado River and Northern California to supplement local supplies, and helps its members to develop increased water conservation, recycling, storage, and other resource-management programs.
